

Joe Bonlender (Cloverhill Dairy, Campbellsport, WI – 750 Holsteins, 25,000 lbs.RHA)

We've recently added **TAKE-OFF DRENCH** to our fresh cow program. Now our cows are more alert and more aggressive at the feed bunk. We see less ketosis, acidosis, and displaced abomasums. So not only are our cows healthier, they make more milk, too.

We pump our fresh cows and they immediately head for the bunk to eat. It's especially helpful for cows that have twins or don't clean. By pumping cows and monitoring body temperatures we've seen fewer metabolic diseases, and reduced culling, especially with cows culled in early lactation. It really helps cows that calve during hot weather.

Jim Melichar (Melichar Farms, Port Washington, WI – 460 Holsteins, 25,500 lbs. RHA)

Our veterinarian recommended we try **TAKE-OFF DRENCH** on our fresh cows. We wanted to test it, so we used it on every other fresh cow, to see what difference we would find.
